Confession (Please sit)

We have come together in the name of Christ, to offer our praise and thanksgiving, to hear and receive God's holy word, to pray for the needs of the world, and to seek the forgiveness of our sins, that by the power of the Holy Spirit we may give ourselves to the service of God.

Jesus says, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.' So let us turn away from our sin and turn to Christ, confessing our sins in penitence and faith.

Most merciful God,
Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,
we confess that we have sinned
in thought and word and deed.
We have not loved you with our
whole heart and we have not loved
our neighbours as ourselves.

In your mercy forgive what we have been, help us to amend what we are, and direct what we shall be; that we may do justly, love mercy and walk humbly with you, our God.

Sermon (Please sit)

The sermon is followed by a moment a prayer of response and then an affirmation of faith.

(Please Stand)

Let us declare our faith in God: We believe in God the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named. We believe in God the Son, who lives in our hearts through faith, and fills us with his love. We believe in God the Holy Spirit, who strengthens us with power from on high. We believe in one God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen or

Let us affirm our faith in Jesus Christ the Son of God:

Though he was divine, he did not cling to equality with God, but made himself nothing.

Taking the form of a slave, he was born in human likeness.

He humbled himself and was obedient to death, even death on a cross.

Therefore God has raised him on high, and given him the name that is above every name: that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, and every voice proclaim that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. Amen

A moment of quiet

Gathering our prayers and praises together, we pray with confidence as our Saviour Jesus has taught us.

We sing:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory for ever and ever. Amen

Hymn (Please stand)

During this hymn a collection is taken. The following prayer or other is said by the minister:

We give thanks to God for the blessings of all that we receive and can give back to him:

God of life, Saviour of the poor in Spirit, receive with this money and that given in other ways, our gratitude for your goodness. May all of our time, talents and wealth be used to proclaim your Good News and to extend your kingdom to the glory of your name. Amen

The Blessing

(Please Stand)

One of these blessings may be used, or other according to the season:

The peace of God, which passes all understanding, keep our hearts and minds in the knowledge and love of God, and of his Son Jesus Christ our Lord; and the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be among us and remain with us always. **Amen.**

or

The Lord bless us and keep us, the Lord make his face to shine upon us and be gracious to us, the Lord look kindly on us and give us peace.

And the blessing of God, Father Son and Holy Spirit, be upon us and remain with us now and always. **Amen** or

The Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, be with us all evermore. Amen
