Finally, thank you so much to all of you who have responded to our recent '**Giving in Grace**' stewardship appeal. Overall we have had about 31 responses which has been lovely, but we have yet to hear from about 100 of you who kindly support. If you can let us know a response (that you can increase your giving, or not at this time) that would be really helpful so we can plan ahead.

So far we have pledged about £6,500pa of additional giving, but which leaves us £20,000pa to go to our target £25,000pa. Between us all, and new people, we hope that this target is achievable and might be pledged, so we can continue to run all of our ministry and mission into 2026. To achieve this would be £200 per person, with some able to give more and some less....we do hope this might be possible across us all, so please do think and pray and give what you can.

Distribution of Communion

This note is to let you know that after discussion with the Diocese,

we have been advised that it would be good to move back to a more normal distribution of communion by receiving the bread and wine **separately**, without dipping the wafer in the wine, by the priest, or by ourselves as communicants.

Covid and other infections are now an ongoing part of life, so we will need to be responsive to whatever develops. Most churches are doing likewise, and have already made this move. The Cathedral moved back to receiving bread and wine separately in 2022.

We do understand that how we receive communion is very personal, and there might be specific reasons that mean you don't feel able to receive in separate kinds, (in the short or longer term), and if this is the case, please let us know. **We don't want anyone to feel that they can't join in public worship or receive communion.**

With this change, you may consider only receiving bread, but not wine. If you decide to do this, perhaps for a period, **you do not need to worry that you are receiving a 'lesser' Communion.**

The divine nature of the communion sacrament, means that you receive the full benefits of Jesus' Passion and sacrifice when you receive in one kind only, or if neither bread or wine were available to use. **Sacraments are outward signs of an inward truth, that is unseen, but real.**

In summary, we would suggest that if you are unwell, or vulnerable, for a particular period of time, to just receive communion in one kind i.e., the wafer/bread, or come for a blessing.

We would propose that we start from the beginning of August for a trial period of August, and then review for the Autumn.
