FREE STREET ROAD WORKS

Hampshire County Council are improving access to Bishop's Waltham Junior and Infant Schools by putting in a new pedestrian entrance, footway link and crossing on Free St, just north of the Church Hall. The work is due to take around four weeks and will begin on the 30th July. Due to the width of Free Street, it will be necessary to close the road to through traffic. Access will be maintained for Churchgoers, but some on-street parking spaces will be suspended. The council have told us, wherever possible barriers and signs will be moved and the road opened during evenings and weekends, however this is **NOT** guaranteed.
