16th AUGUST 2020- HOW SHOULD I LIVE NOW? Genesis 1:26-31 & Luke 12:13-21

26-28 God spoke: "Let us make human beings in our image, make them reflecting our nature so they can be responsible for the fish in the sea, the birds in the air, the cattle, and, yes, earth itself and every animal that moves on the face of the earth."

God created human beings; he created them godlike, reflecting God's nature. He created them male and female. He said "Prosper! Reproduce! Fill Earth! Take charge! Be responsible for fish in the sea and birds in the air, for every living thing that moves on the face of Earth."

29-30 Then God said, "I've given you every sort of seed-bearing plant on earth and every kind of fruit-bearing tree, given them to you for food. To all animals and all birds, everything that moves and breathes, I give whatever grows out of the ground for food." And there it was.

31 God looked over everything he had made; it was so good, so very good! It was evening, it was morning—Day Six.

In the days leading up to this, the world had been created. Note the difference between the word made and created. To create something means to start from scratch.

Now imagine that you were feeling really upset because of a friendship problem. Look at the next list, again on a mark them on a scale of 1-10 (same scale as previous list)


- Mum takes you to MacDonald's

Luke 12:13-21 The Greedy Farmer

13 Someone out of the crowd said, "Teacher, order my brother to give me a fair share of the family inheritance." 14 He replied, "Mister, what makes you think it's any of my business to be a judge or mediator for you?" 15 Speaking to the people, he went on, "Take care! Protect yourself against the least bit of greed. Life is not defined by what you have, even when you have a lot." 16-19 Then he told them this story: "The farm of a certain rich man produced a terrific crop. He talked to himself: 'What can I do? My barn isn't big enough for this harvest.' Then he said, 'Here's what I'll do: I'll tear down my barns and build bigger ones. Then I'll gather in all my grain and goods, and I'll say to myself, Self, you've done well! You've got it made and can now retire. Take it easy and have the time of your life!' 20 "Just then God showed up and said, 'Fool! Tonight you die. And your barnful of goods—who gets it?' 21 "That's what happens when you fill your barn with Self and not with God."

JESUS ALSO SAID THIS IN MATTHEW 6:19-21

"Don't hoard treasure down here where it gets eaten by moths and corroded by rust or—worse!— stolen by burglars. Stockpile treasure in heaven, where it's safe from moth and rust and burglars. It's obvious, isn't it? The place where your treasure is, is the place you will most want to be, and end up being."

Have you ever wanted something because everyone else has got it?

Do you know what these are: they have all been very popular in their day and it is common to find yourself thinking you must have something 'because everyone else has it.' A common phrase you might hear is 'passing phase' or 'the latest craze' or the 'latest fad.' They are not always what we need


















