## BY YOUR FRUITS WILL YOU BE KNOWN- Luke 6:43-45 AUG 23<sup>rd</sup> 2020

43 "No good tree bears bad fruit, nor does a bad tree bear good fruit. 44 Each tree is recognized by its own fruit. People do not pick figs from thornbushes, or grapes from briers. 45 A good man brings good things out of the good stored up in his heart, and an evil man brings evil things out of the evil stored up in his heart. For the mouth speaks what the heart is full of.

'The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.' (Galatians 5:22-23)

Well this week we're just going to look at what they might mean for us today.

Now have a think about this:

What does the acorn need in order to help it to grow into the oak tree?

As we all look to grow more fruitful on our frontlines; we need a certain mix of things to help us to do this and to help us to grow in Christ.

The Luke reading is about how different trees bear different fruits and the Galatians reading is about what different fruits we need to bear as Christians.

Have you heard the saying – 'you are what you eat?' If that is true, it is truer that you are what you say. Your words reveal your heart. The things you say, and how you say them expose and unveil the condition and attitudes of your heart. If more people understood this do you think they would be more careful about what they said and how they said it?

We are experts at seeing only the good actions in our lives, and overlooking or excusing the bad. If you want to judge your own character, listen to what you say.

So really both these readings are about what we should be like as Jesus asks us.

Last week in the activity pack there was a sentence about looking up what the Beatitudes were about (if you had time.) These are 8 sort of 'guidelines' if you like taught by Jesus about being happy as well- this version is from The Message with the help of Douglas for a couple.

- 1-2 When Jesus saw his ministry drawing huge crowds, he climbed a hillside. Arriving at a quiet place, he sat down and taught his climbing companions. This is what he said:
- 3 "You're blessed when you're at the end of your rope. With less of you there is more of God and his rule.
- 4 "You're blessed when you feel you've lost what is most dear to you. Only then can you be embraced by the One most dear to you.- https://youtu.be/DN1Wacruvjw?list=TLPQMTqwODIwMjDnO5QwGnu-Pq
- 5 "You're blessed when you're content with just who you are—no more, no less. That's the moment you find yourselves proud owners of everything that can't be bought.- <a href="https://youtu.be/E5-">https://youtu.be/E5-</a>

6 "You're blessed when you've worked up a good appetite for God. He's food and drink in the best meal you'll ever eat.

7 "You're blessed when you care. At the moment of being 'care-full,' you find yourselves cared for.

8 "You're blessed when you get your inside world—your mind and heart—put right. Then you can see God in the outside world.

9 "You're blessed when you can show people how to cooperate instead of compete or fight. 10 "You're blessed when your commitment to God provokes persecution. The persecution drives you even deeper into God's kingdom.

11-12 "Not only that—count yourselves blessed every time people put you down or throw you out or speak lies about you to discredit me. What it means is that the truth is too close for comfort and they are uncomfortable. You can be glad when that happens—give a cheer, even!—for though they don't like it, I do! And all heaven applauds. And know that you are in good company. My prophets and witnesses have always got into this kind of trouble.

These are hard to live out. But they are also very beautiful. They describe what it means to live by a set of standards, callings and attitudes that go way beyond the observation of rules or the keeping of the law. This is what life looks like when you are truly Christ-like.








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## Beatitude Crossword
