REMEMBRANCE DAY SERVICE**



This year's **Remembrance Day Service** is still taking place
in St Peter's Church on **Sunday 8th November**



The capacity of the Church as a result of COVID is only 72, assuming one person in each designated seat, but this can be increased if members of the same household sit together. The usual COVID security measures will be in place, including 2 meter social distancing, hand sanitising on arrival and the wearing of face coverings at all times. Also, in view of COVID, it is not possible to hold a parade but it is hoped that representatives of the community and uniformed groups will attend. The laying of the wreath will be done in a COVID secure way at the end of the Service.

Please arrive from 10.30 am so that you can be checked back to the Track and Trace list. You will then be shown to your seat for the start of the Service at 10.50 am

In view of the capacity constraints, it is likely that not everybody who wishes to attend will be able to do so. In view of this, please note that those who have not booked will not be able to attend the Service unless there are spaces left over after allowing for the pre-booked numbers. However, if capacity is reached and/or you are not able to attend, then the Service will also be streamed via the St Peter's Facebook page and You Tube channel.
