31st January - Leprosy Mission Day



Leprosy exists in many parts of the world, mainly in India, Nepal, Brazil and Indonesia and some African nations. The Leprosy Mission is present in almost 50 countries around the world. Every year between two and three hundred thousand people are diagnosed with leprosy, and an estimated two to three million around the world are disabled because of it.

If diagnosed early, effective treatment can halt the disease. However, many sufferers hide the disease, due to fear of stigma and rejection resulting in disfigurement and disability.

Please remember in your prayers, all those affected with leprosy, and for the work of the Leprosy Mission, founded in 1874. An organisation that continues to raise awareness of leprosy and to bring hope and healing.

The Leprosy Mission Prayer

Almighty Father, the giver of life and health, look mercifully on those who suffer from leprosy.

Stretch out your hand to touch and heal them as Jesus did during his earthly life. Grant wisdom and insight to those who are seeking the prevention and cure of the disease; give skill and sympathy to those who minister to the patients; reunite the separated with their families and friends; and inspire your people with the task set before The Leprosy Mission, that it may never lack either the staff or the means to carry on its healing work, in accordance with your will, and to the glory of your holy name.

News from Japan

As some of you may know, we have a link with Chris and Kesia Pain, working in Japan for OMF (Overseas Missionary Fellowship)
The following is a precis of their recent prayer news bulletin.
They have a desire to see more long term field workers, and although 30 candidates have recently been approved, there are opportunities for ministry which at the present time, are unable to be achieved, due to lack of workers.

For each person working for OMF to be diligent and bold in their personal outreach

It is hoped that Japan's borders will re-open soon, (closed during January due to the new virus strains), and for their two son's schooling, which has been disrupted.

Throughout lockdown we have continued to patrol adapting our patrol format, times and places to be where we are needed. With the growth and requests for patrols we are in need of more volunteers for night-time patrols, evening community patrols and for afternoon community patrols.

However, we hope that for many of us we will be able to do as much as we can.


Our budget Gap is £28,000, which seems a large sum, but between us all, we are hopeful that this can be addressed.

This is a prayer time for all where we will just pray simply together.


